### 1. Introduction

The Hull Local Safeguarding Board Training Programme (April 2018 – March 2019) directly correlates to the Hull LSCB Learning & Development Strategy.

It is of paramount importance that prospective course candidates read about 'Learning Pathways' in section 2 and on each course outline page, prior to applying for courses in order to ensure that they are meeting the pre-determined route to learning as identified in the Learning & Development Strategy. Learning pathways are determined primarily by:

- Role and function within the organisation in which people work
- Level of accountability in respect of safeguarding decision-making within the children, young people and families arena

Candidates should note that for some courses there are mandatory pre-requisites.

## 2. Learning Pathways

Prospective course candidates should take the time to think about their role and function within the organisation/agency of which they are a part in order to identify the most useful courses for them and, any 'essential' course they should be attending in order to fulfil their duties to children, young people and families.

Candidates should also think about the requirements upon them in relation to any decision-making they may be responsible for about safeguarding children.

'Working Together 2010' helpfully describes the children's workforce and suggests training requirements grouped by role 'type' and the degree and nature of their contact with children.

The table over page uses this framework and details 'essential' and 'recommended' training for each group. You will find clear guidance on all course pre-requisites as determined by the learning pathway on the Learning Pathway page and each course outline page.

Working Together 2015/2018 emphasises that employers are responsible for ensuring that their staff are competent to carry out their responsibilities for safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and creating an environment where staff feel able to raise concerns and feel supported in their safeguarding role.

### 3. Training Application Process

Staff who work for Hull City Council should apply for Learning and Development using the Oracle Learning Management System (OLM).

Learning Pathway: <u>before attending this course</u> participants must have attended Safeguarding Children – A Shared Responsibility (Level 1) Awareness, Recognition & Responses

#### Course Details:

Cultural competence is respectful of and responsive to the beliefs, practices and cultural and linguistic needs of diverse communities. There are five essential elements that contribute to an individual professional's, and a whole service's, ability to become more culturally competent. The professional or service must:

- Value diversity
- Have the capacity for cultural self-assessment
- Be conscious of the 'dynamics' interest when cultures interact
- Institutionalise cultural knowledge, and
- Develop adaptations to service delivery reflecting an understanding of diversity between and within cultures.

## **Course Objectives:**

- To enable learners to deepen their awareness of their own assumptions, values and prejudices
- To enable participants to develop confidence in expressing and exploring their lack of awareness of cultural issues

## Domestic Abuse and Young People – Identifying and Managing Risk

(Providing a risk lead approach to young people experiencing abuse in their intimate and family relationships)

Target Group: Recommended for Group 2 and above.

Learning Pathway: <u>before attending this course</u> participants must have attended Safeguarding Children – A Shared Responsibility (Level 1) Awareness, Recognition & Responses, and

Domestic Abuse Awareness: The Impact of Domestic Abuse on Adults, Children and the Community

### **Course Aims:**

This session aims to offer a common tool for agencies to use and to provide a shared understanding of risk in relation to domestic abuse, stalking, and honour based violence in young people's relationships.

The SafeLives Young People's Risk Identification Checklist (RIC) is a tool which is used nationally by practitioners who come into contact with young people aged 13-17 years who are experiencing domestic abuse.

The Young People's RIC tool helps practitioners to identify known risks in domestic abuse and includes specific considerations in relation to young people to inform professional judgement and safety planning. It will help to identify suitable cases to be referred to MARAC and inform referrals to children's social care.

### **Course Objectives:**

Participants will increase their knowledge and understanding of:

- The dynamics of domestic abuse and how this is different for young people
- What adolescence is, how it impacts on a young person's behaviour and what the implications of this are for practice
- What the key risk factors for serious harm are for young people experiencing domestic abuse and how to safety plan with them in a multi-agency context
- The role of Multi-Agency Risk Assessment Conferences and Children's Services in increasing the safety of young people in abusive relationships

- Examined agencies responsibilities in relation to risk identification, assessment & management.
- Explained some of the lessons learned from the risk identification, assessment & management process.
- Described the Multi-Agency Risk Assessment Conference (MARAC) process and understand the guidance around this.

- Developed an understanding of the effects of domestic abuse on children and young people.
- Developed an understanding of the impact of domestic abuse on the parent/ child relationship.
- Gained knowledge of how to offer appropriate help and support to adults, children and young people who are or have experienced domestic abuse

By the end of the course participants will have:

- Explored the potential impact for those working in the arena of sexual harm and identified support strategies.
- Considered the potential impact of sexual harm on children, young people and their families.
- Gained an understanding of age appropriate sexual development and what constitutes harmful sexual behaviour
- Examined their own attitudes and responses to child sexual abuse and sexual exploitation.
- Reflected on key issues which influence the process of supporting children, young people and their families.
- Explored the Finklehor Model of sexual offending behaviour.
- Gained a working knowledge of the legislative framework and local and national guidance and policies in relation to sexual harm.

It also provides additional activities for children and young people to access on line where appropriate.

## **Course Aims:**

To develop an improved understanding regarding Modern Day Slavery including an exploration of types and trends, to enable practitioners to respond appropriately.

## **Course Objectives**

- Explore types and trends of Modern Day Slavery
- Exploring the push and pull factors that lead people to becoming enslaved
- Examining motivation and methods of slave masters
